
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
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
- Now as a concession, not a command, I say this.

Old Testament book: Song of Soloman

MORE THAN I MILLION COPIES SOLD

Date of Writing: Solomon wrote this song (poem) around 965 B.C.

The Song of Solomon is a *lyric poem* written to extol the virtues of *love between a husband and his wife*.

The poem clearly presents marriage as God's design. A man and woman are to live together within the context of marriage, loving each other spiritually, emotionally, and physically.

This book combats two extremes:

asceticism (the denial of all pleasure)
and hedonism (the pursuit of only pleasure).
The marriage profiled in Song of Solomon is

To the married I give this charge (not I, but the Lord):
the wife should not separate from her husband
(but if she does, she should remain unmarried or
else be reconciled to her husband),
and the husband should not divorce his wife.

Two exceptions:

- Adultery (sexual unfaithfulness)
- Abandonment (rejects responsibility)

12 To the rest I say (I, not the Lord) that if any brother has a wife who is an unbeliever, and she consents to live with him, he should not divorce her. If any woman has a husband who is an unbeliever, and he consents to live with her, she should not divorce him. 14 For the unbelieving husband is made holy because of his wife, and the unbelieving wife is made holy because of her husband.
