⁶ Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons.

⁷ Jesus said to the servants, “Fill the jars with water”; so they filled them to the brim.

⁸ Then he told them, “Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet.”

They did so, ⁹ and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside ¹⁰ and said, “Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now.”

¹¹ What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

A Few Reflective Thoughts We Can Take From John 2

1. Jesus Cares about little things in our lives because he deeply cares about us.

His 1st miracle was not restoring sight or hearing to a broken person, it was not calming a raging storm with his mere voice, nor was it raising anyone from the dead. His 1st miracle was turning water into wine so that the party could continue.

2. Jesus was invited.

He was invited to this wedding, he was invited to bring the solution to a problem so that the celebration could continue.

What are you wrestling with on your own life that you need to invite him into?



A Few Reflective Thoughts We Can Take From John 2

3. The disciples believed in Him (they trusted Him) and we can too.

Will you trust him with your life & your circumstances?

If Jesus can take 150 gallons of dirty water and turn it into the choicest of wine, just think what he can do with you and with me if we? Will you trust him?
